PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

BONGA GIRLS







The Bonga Project (meaning "Let's Talk) is an empowerment programme for out-of-school girls and young women aged 11-19 in Uganda. The young girls enrolled have either never had access to, or dropped out of the formal education system, as a result of various cultural and life impediments most commonly a lack of school fees, teenage pregnancy or early marriages. The programme is now in its second year and has helped over 120 girls and young women.

The Bonga project creates communities of support and reliable social networks for vulnerable girls and women. The project is a 1-year programme, which focuses on life skills and business skills training, as well as vocational training. After the programme, the girls and young women can access business start-up loans through Edukid's microfinance project.

Akello Brenda

Akello Brenda is currently enrolled at the Bonga project, where she is training to become a hairdresser. Brenda didn't have an easy start to life. During the coronavirus lockdown, whilst she was still a primary school student, Brenda got pregnant. She could not return to school after, and the father of her child denied responsibility.

Brenda had previously told us that her dream was to become a doctor. She felt that she had lost all of her hope, self-worth, and dignity now that she was not able to continue with her education. She felt neglected and told us she regretted getting pregnant so young.

After hearing about the Bonga project, Brenda told us how excited she was and she immediately came to register. Beyond just the new knowledge and skills she gets from the centre, Brenda told us how much she values the friendships she has developed with other girls in similar situations to her. She feels comfort in sharing her problems with friends and benefiting from the help and advice they can offer. Keeping busy also helps her to manage her worries and stress. Since joining the centre, she has been inspired by one of the business salon owners that came to present to them. Brenda said that she now has gained hope and a new focus to become a hairdresser!



PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS



SEND PROJECT

Edukid's 'Inclusive Education Programme' focuses on enabling children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) to be able to access school and education. In Uganda there are many misconceptions surrounding those with SEND, and so for a long time there has been a social barrier that the children have faced in accessing education. Edukid help to provide inclusive learning materials, assistive devices, and training for teachers to ensure that the barriers faced by students with SEND are removed and they can fulfil their right to an education!

Ivan and Francisco are two students who are enrolled at Gulu Disabled Peoples Union, as part of the Edukid's Inclusive Education Programme. They are currently studying for a Certificate in Craft and Design. During a recent visit to Uganda, Ivan and Francisco taught the group to make the most beautiful bracelets and necklaces!

THE GIRLS DORMITORY: A YEAR ON...

On the 7th of the July 2022 the Girls Dormitory was official opened at Koch Goma Primary School!

Since the opening, 182 girls aged 13-17 years old have benefited from staying in the dormitory. The dormitory has provided a safe place for some of the most vulnerable young girls; a space where they can learn and thrive, free from risks of domestic violence, abuse and child marriage.

Aber Prisca is one of the many girls who has been living in the dormitory for the past year. Prisca used to walk to and from school everyday - a total of 14km per day - all whilst walking in the dark. This journey was extremely unsafe for Prisca.

Since joining the girls dormitory, Prisca's learning and level of concentration has improved, and she is so happy that she can now enjoy time with her friends. She no longer has the worry of waking up early and walking the long distance to school.

RIGHTS INCLUSIVE SUSTAINABLE EDUCATION

The RISE Programme (standing for rights, inclusivity, and sustainability in and through education) is an exiciting programme that Edukid has implemented this year in Uganda with the supportive funding of the IPSOS Foundation.

The RISE programme was created by the community themselves, developed out of requests from community leaders following two previous projects Edukid worked on in Uganda.

RISE is establishing a network of safeguarding and support for the whole community, with additional support provided for girls and children with disabilities. It does this through many impactful activities that happen at the home, school, and community level, such as teacher training, boy/girl talk sessions for studies, counselling sessions, and community-based activities tackling key community issues.

Excitingly, the RISE project also enabled Edukid to hire 3 teachers across 3 schools in Uganda, who provide safeguarding support to students and ongoing training to teachers.

We are excited to see the continued impact of the RISE project as it moves into the new year!
